Remember, if someone comes to every meeting for a year you are only seeing that person 12 times in that year.

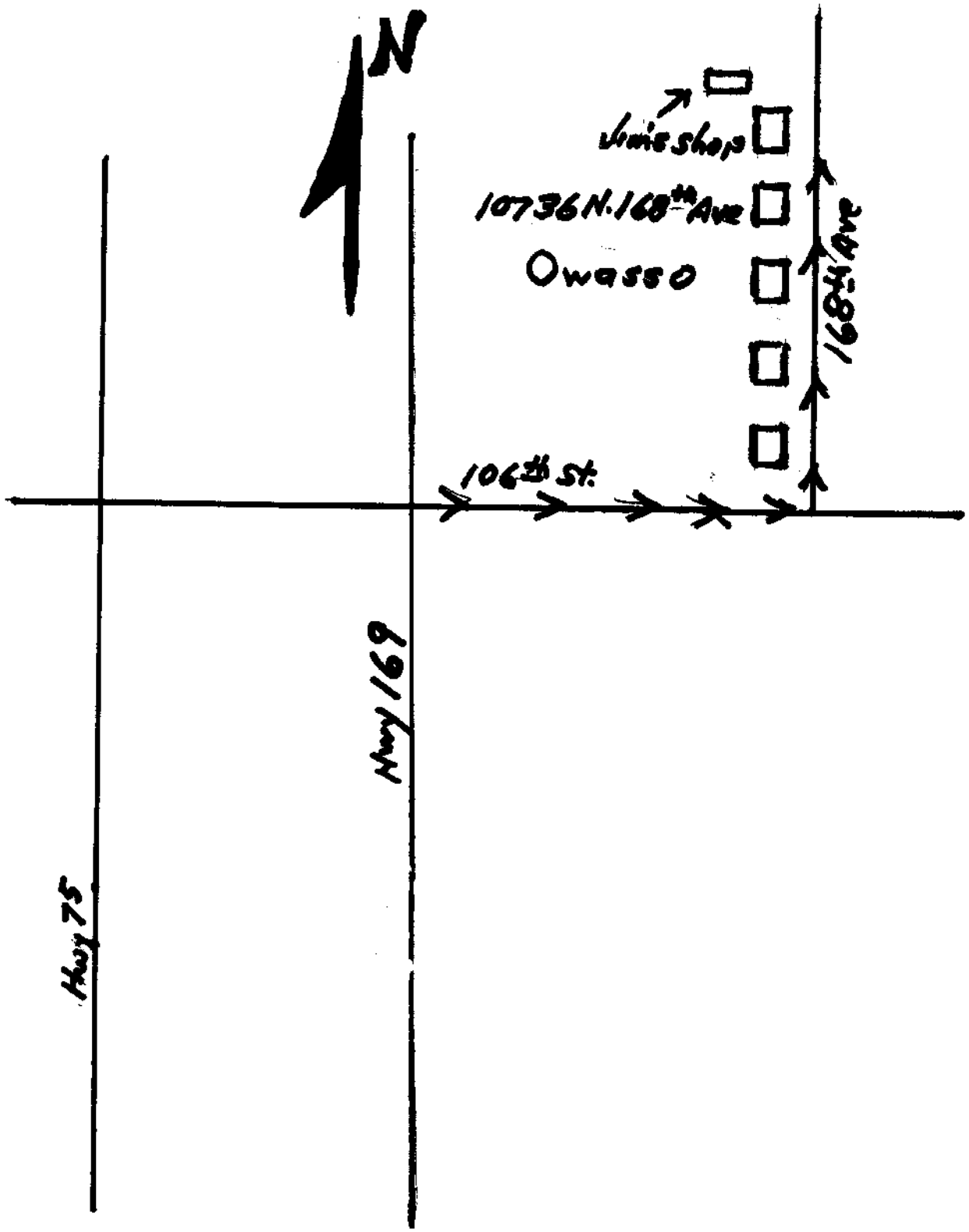
